



Pronouns for Class 4

Here, we will learn about Pronouns for Class 4: Definitions, Types, Examples, Worksheet, and PDF.

Definition of the pronoun for class 4: A pronoun is a kind of phrase that replaces a noun. (*I, me, he, she, you, it, that, they, each, few, many, who, someone, everybody, etc.*)

Pronouns can be used to speak about an individual or factor or extra than one individual or thing.

Singular	Plural
I	We
You	You
He/She	They
Me	Us
It	Them
Him/Her	Them

Let us learn more about pronouns from the examples:

1. **Neha, Karan, and I** were playing hockey with friends.
We were playing hockey with [friends](#).
2. **Susan** loves watching movies.
She loves watching movies.
3. Will **Deepak** be going to the **circus** with **Sarah**?
Will **he** be going **there** with **her**?
4. **Tom** and **Peter** are good at playing basketball.
They are good at playing basketball.
5. **Myra** bought books from **Ajay**.
She bought books from **him**.

Types of Pronoun

There are 5 types of pronouns according to the class 4 syllabus. So here, we will cover only the following types listed below:



1. Personal pronouns
2. Possessive pronouns
3. Interrogative pronouns
4. Demonstrative pronouns
5. Distributive pronouns

1. Personal pronouns

The pronouns *I, we, he, she, it, the, her, him, us, we, me*, and you are called personal pronouns. They come in *place of people, animals, or things*.

3 Types of Personal Pronouns

The first person refers to the speaker or the group that includes the speaker.

Example - I, me, we, us

The second person is the speaker's audience or the person being spoken to.

Example - you

The third person is the person spoken about.

Example - he, she, him, her, it, they, them

Personal Pronoun Examples:-

1. **His** father is a lawyer.
2. When **we** get to the bridge, let's cross it.
3. **You** learn to write by writing.
4. **He** plays badminton in our academy.
5. It's simple to do what **we** want.
6. **He** is wise and trustworthy.
7. **They** will come on Saturday.
8. All of **them** are good dancers
9. **Her** dress is very beautiful.
10. **They** are playing cricket.

2. Possessive pronoun

A possessive pronoun is a word that replaces a noun (or a noun phrase) and indicates ownership like "*mine*," "*yours*," "*his*," "*hers*," "*ours*," and "*theirs*".

Examples:-

1. This pen is **mine**.
2. The cricket pad is **theirs**.
3. This seat is **mine**. Where is **yours**?
4. We finished our dinner. How about **yours**?
5. This is all **our books**.
6. The entire security force is **theirs**.
7. She is our class teacher, not **yours**.
8. These are **my** books.
9. These all are my fans, not **hers**.
10. My friend always refuses to travel. **His** back pain increases during travel.

3. Interrogative pronoun

Interrogative pronouns are a kind of pronouns that are used to ask questions. Their antecedent is the reply to the *question*, both a noun, noun *phrase*, or *pronoun*.

Interrogative pronouns reply to open-ended questions, which means the reply varies between options. They encompass *what, who, where, when, why, which, whose, whom, and how*.

Examples:-

1. To those **who** believe in God.
2. **What** can i expect from you?
3. Age remembers **what** youth forgets.
4. Those **who** help themselves are blessed by God.
5. **Whose** idea is it, anyway?
6. **What** is your today's strategy?
7. **Who** is to blame for this?
8. Only he **whose** homework is completed.
9. With **whom** are you going to travel?
10. **When** is your birthday?

4. Demonstrative pronoun

A demonstrative pronoun is a pronoun that represents a noun and expresses its function as close to or some distance like "*this*," "*that*," "*these*," and "*those*".

Examples:-

1. Please give me **this** ball pen to write something.
2. He wants **those** skating shoes for practice.
3. She accepts her fault at **that** moment.
4. **This** kind of behavior is very rude.
5. **That** incident was unforgettable for me.
6. **This** place is better than **that** one.
7. **This** pen has a beautiful writing experience.
8. Why were you following **that** person last night?
9. Do **these** books belong to you?
10. Are **those** your pictures?

5. Distributive pronouns

Distributive pronouns can be described as “Distributive pronoun considers participants of a crew separately, as a substitute than collectively. They consist of *each, any, either, neither, and others.*”

Examples:-

1. **Neither** of you had completed your work.
2. **Each** of the students should pay money.
3. **Neither** of my parents is a teacher.
4. **Each** one of them has its duty.
5. **Everyone** is enjoying his company.
6. **Everyone** participated in the drama act.
7. **Either** of these two gifts is yours.
8. **Neither** of them did well in exams.
9. What is the cost of traveling for **each** person?
10. **Either** Misha or Rahul will go to classes?
