- Write down the key points you would like to celebrate.
- Start writing after leaving one line from the extreme left corner of the page.
- It is written in the first person.
- Thoughts are gathered over the theme and an emotional description regarding the same is provided.
- Repetition of the same words/lines is avoided and grammatical accuracy is maintained.

Example 1


A recent visit to a blind school in your city has made extremely sympathetic and thoughtful for the need of helping the physically challenged. Express your thoughts in the form of a diary entry.
